**1. Important Policy Decisions/Major Achievements during the Month:-**

• **Meeting of the Cabinet Committee on Parliamentary Affairs**

The Cabinet Committee on Parliamentary Affairs in its meeting held on Thursday, the 10<sup>th</sup> November, 2022, considered this Ministry's Note No 07/2022 dated 10<sup>th</sup> November, 2022 regarding summoning of Winter Session, 2022 and approved that both Houses of Parliament may be summoned for its Winter Session, 2022 on Wednesday, the 07<sup>th</sup> of December, 2022 and subject to exigencies of Government Business, the Session may conclude on Thursday, the 29<sup>th</sup> of December, 2022.

A meeting was taken by Hon'ble Minister of Parliamentary Affairs with Secretaries/Senior Officers of various Ministries/Department, on 15<sup>th</sup> November, 2022, to assess and finalize the Government Business for Winter Session, 2022.

• **Implementation of Assurances in Parliament**

During the month of November, 2022, no new Assurances was culled out from Lok Sabha / Rajya Sabha were proceedings as there were no sittings of Parliament during this period.

• **Functioning of Consultative Committees**

- (c) Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalaya, Aligrah, Uttar Pradesh has conducted a special sitting of Youth Parliament on the theme of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav on 30<sup>th</sup> November, 2022.
- (d) Zonal Level Evaluation of 33<sup>rd</sup> National Youth Parliamentary Competition, 2022-23 for Kendriya Vidyalas were conducted in the following places:-

- **Celebration of Constitution Day, 2022 on 26<sup>th</sup> November, 2022:**

As part of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav, Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs celebrated the Constitution Day, 2022 on 26th November 2022 to commemorate the adoption of the Constitution of India and to honour and acknowledge the contribution of Founding Fathers of the Constitution. For spreading the celebrations to every nook and corner of the country, Special emphasis was laid on mass reading of Preamble to the Constitution on 26.11.2022 at 11:00 AM.

Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment was the nodal Ministry for celebration of Constitution Day, 2022. However, this Ministry also celebrated the occasion with great fervor for ensuring Jan Bhagidari.

The celebration of the Constitution Day on 26th November, 2022 was initiated with reading of the Preamble to the Constitution by all the employees at 11 A.M. The Ministry also revamped and updated its two web-portals, first Online reading of Preamble to Constitution in 22 Official Languages and English (<https://readpreamble.nic.in/>) and second Online Quiz on Indian Constitution (<https://constitutionquiz.nic.in/>).

More than 13 lakh people from all over the country participated this year on both the portals as compared to 6.45 lakh people participation last year.

- **National e-Vidhan Application (NeVA)**

During the month of November , 2022 the following activities were undertaken on NeVA front:

**1. Visit by officials from Haryana Assembly-**

a. 3 officials from Haryana Assembly visited CPMU NeVA cell at Parliament House Annexe, New Delhi from 23rd Nov. 2022 to 25th Nov. 2022. In the visit the officials were given training in Digital archives and Reporter module along with resolution of queries related to other modules of NeVA platform.

**2. Exhibition by NeVA, MoPA team at 25th NeGC held at Katra, Jammu**

a. A 2 member team was deputed to Katra, Jammu to establish a stall to showcase NeVA platform at the exhibition function of 25th National conference on eGovernance held on 26-27th Nov. 2022. At the exhibition, visitors visiting the stall were given first hand information about NeVA project along with replying their queries. Suitable steps were also undertaken to make them understand the NeVA software and it's significance properly. This was done to spread awareness about the digital initiatives undertaken by Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs as part of encouraging good governance.

**3. Video Conferencing workshop -**

a. Central Project Monitoring Unit, NeVA conducted an online workshop on 14<sup>th</sup> November, 2022 so as to resolve the issues faced and to consider the suggestions from the officials of UP Assembly with respect to the NeVA platform.

b. CPMU NeVA also conducted an online workshop through video conferencing on 28th Nov. 2022 for the officials of Bihar Legislative Council to clear their doubts arising from NeVA implementation and to give training in Digital archives and Reporter's module of NeVA platform.
