During the Special Campaign 2.0 on Disposal of Pending Matters (SCPDM), from 2nd October to 31st October, 2022, focus is on disposal of public grievances, references from the Members of Parliament, Parliament Assurances, Cleanliness drive, disposal of scrap and weeding out of files /Record Management etc.

During the campaign, Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs has achieved the following:

- a. Target of 373 Physical files review was achieved.
- b. Target of 461 e-files review was achieved.
- c. 226 files weeded out during the Special Campaign 2.0.
- d. Revenue of Rs. 1,23,810/- was generated by selling of scraps.

The Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs deals with Public Grievances and PMO references on priority basis and due to prompt and immediate action pendency was NIL during the campaign.
