Subject: - Monthly Summary for the month of May, 2021 of Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs.

1. IMPLEMENTATION OF ASSURANCES IN PARLIAMENT

This Ministry is the co-ordinating agency to ensure that the Ministries fulfill their assurances, given by the concerned Ministers while replying to questions or supplementary thereon or during discussion on Bills, Resolutions, Motions in Parliament, in time. The Ministry extracts from the daily proceedings of both the Houses, assurances given by Ministers and forward the same to concerned Ministries for necessary action. The Implementation Reports received from administrative ministries in fulfilment of an assurance are laid on the Table of the respective Houses.

From 1956 to April, 2021 a total of 96800 Assurances were culled out in Lok Sabha and 56929 Assurances were culled out in Rajya Sabha. Out of these 1669 Assurances of Lok Sabha and 850 Assurances of Rajya Sabha are pending.

During the month of May, 2021, 40 Assurances were culled out from Lok Sabha proceedings and 15 Assurances were culled out from Rajya Sabha proceedings.

2. <u>FOLLOW UP ACTION ON MATTERS RAISED UNDER RULE 377 IN LOK SABHA</u> AND BY WAY OF SPECIAL MENTION IN RAJYA SABHA.

Members of the Lok Sabha who wish to bring to the notice of the House any matter which is not a point of order, are permitted by the Speaker to raise the matter under the rule 377 of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in Lok Sabha. In the Rajya Sabha, the Chairman permits the members to mention the matters of urgent public importance, generally known as special mentions, under Rule 180 A-E of the Rules of Procedure and conduct of Business in the Rajya Sabha. The Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs takes follow up action on such matters raised by Members of both houses of period.

3. FUNCTIONING OF CONSULTATIVE COMMITTEES

Informal Consultative Committees were constituted for various Ministries/Departments of Government of India, first time in the year 1954 to provide opportunities to Members of Parliament to have some glimpse into the working of the Government. Nature of these Committees is advisory. At present 37 Consultative Committees are functioning for various Ministries.

In the month of May 2021, -

- A. Three meetings of Consultative Committees were held.
- B. Four Members of Parliament were removed from various Consultative Committee after their death/retirement during May 2021
- C. One Member of Parliament from Rajya Sabha was nominated on a Consultative Committee

4. DIGITAL GOVERNANCE - IMPLEMENTATION OF e-OFFICE

This Ministry was selected for implementation of e-Office Mission Mode Project (MMP) by Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances (DARPG) in the second phase. From October, 2013 after digitization of physical files, sections of the Ministry were brought under e-office.

All matters relating to leave of employees, service, billing etc are being done in e-office. This has helped the Ministry to be more efficient, lesser usage of paper, rule based file routing, quick search and retrieval of files and office orders. DARPG has awarded this Ministry for commendable performance shown in implementation of e-office.

In the month of May, 2021, most of the work was done electronically and 846 electronic files were moved.

5. <u>NATIONAL e-VIDHAN APPLICATION (NeVA)</u> : <u>ONE NATION – ONE APPLIC ATION</u>

NeVa is a Mission Mode Project under the Digital India Programme. Its mission is to make the legislatures of all the States/UTs paper less, streamline all the processes for information exchange with the different State Government Departments and to publish the allowed contents on the public portal in real time. The NeVA works on both web-based and application based (both Android and IOS) platform, in a format consistent across National and State legislatures.

Various States have adopted the NeVA, a project for digital legislatures and have started working on it. With the sole objective of

knowledge transfer for capacity building of the officials of the legislatures, CPMU, NeVA has started in house training/workshop in association with the concerned Assembly/Council/State NIC.

Up to the month of May, Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for implementation of NeVA has been signed with 16 States (17 Houses) which includes Bihar (both Assembly and Council), Punjab, Odisha, Meghalaya, Manipur, Gujarat, Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Tripura, Chhattisgarh, Sikkim, Puducherry, Himachal Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Haryana and Uttar Pradesh. Detailed Project Reports (DPR) for the sanction of NeVA project have been submitted by 9 States (10 Houses) viz. Punjab, Odisha, Bihar (both Assembly & Council), Nagaland, Manipur, Sikkim, Tamil Nadu, Arunachal Pradesh and Meghalaya out of which first 7 States (8 Houses) have also been paid 1st instalment for implementation of NeVA.

In the month of May, 2021, the following activities were also undertaken on NeVA front:

- A NeVA Online Demo for overview to understand NeVA features and working was given to Maharashtra Assembly, NIC, NeVA Team on 31st May, 2021. In the meeting the officials from both the Maharashtra Vidhan Sabha & Council were present.
- 2. Customising NeVA software as per their requirement of Lok Sabha for implementing e-Sansad in Lok Sabha.
- 3. Active support was given to various state legislatures who have started the implementation of NeVA software through telephonic conversation and video conferencing.
- 4. Various new developments in NeVA software as per requirement of State
 Legislatures were done by the technical team along with some new
 features in the month of May, 2021. These developments include changes
 in NeVA public site, NeVA e-Book, resolving NeVA bugs, changes in NeVA
 secure site and NeVA API for new tabs Budget, Governor Address,
 Economic Survey, Demand and Grants.

6. **SOCIAL MEDIA**

Social Media is an emerging platform for information sharing and receiving feedback. Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs has taken the initiative of getting its presence registered on various social media platforms.

With a total of 1754 tweets, the number of twitter followers for the Ministry's handle https://twitter.com/mpa_india touched 4626 and that

of Facebook's followers became 38104.

7. AZADI KA AMRUT MAHOTSAV

Letters were sent to various state legislatives except Tamilnadu, Kerala, Puducherry, West Bengal and Maharashtra from Hon'ble Minister of Parliamentary Affairs, for celebrating the "Azadi ka Amrut Mahotsav" and for spreading awareness of Azadi ka Amrut Mahotsav in every constituency through various activities viz, awareness lectures, Nukkad Nataks, essay writing etc..
