1. Important Policy Decisions/Major Achievements during the Month:-

● **Implementation of Assurances in Parliament**

From 1956 to April, 2022 a total of 98127 Assurances were culled out in Lok Sabha and 57503 Assurances were culled out in Rajya Sabha. Out of these 1212 Assurances of Lok Sabha and 743 Assurances of Rajya Sabha are pending.

During the month of May, 2022, 66 Assurances were culled out from Lok Sabha proceedings and 24 Assurances were culled out from Rajya Sabha proceedings.

● **Functioning of Consultative Committees**

Informal Consultative Committees were constituted for various Ministries/Departments of Government of India, first time in the year 1954 to provide opportunities to Members of Parliament to have some glimpse into the working of the Government. Nature of these Committees is advisory. At present 39 Consultative Committees are functioning for various Ministries.

In the month of May, 2022 –

- a. 02 Meetings of Consultative Committee were held.
- b. Names of 08 Member of Parliament have been deleted from various Consultative Committees after their death/Retirement during this month.

● **Motivating Youth through Youth Parliament Schemes**

During the month, Registrations of 86 schools for participating in National Youth Parliament Schemes were reviewed and out of them, registrations of 27 schools were approved. Remaining 59 schools have been asked additional information for registration. During the month, 1408 certificates issued.

● **National e-Vidhan Application (NeVA)**

During the month of May, 2022

1. Digitisation of Uttar Pradesh Legislative Assembly

- a) Uttar Pradesh Legislative Assembly adopted NeVA for inside the house digitisation and conducted its Budget Session 2021 via NeVA in paperless mode. UP Assembly also presented its budget for financial year 2022-23 on 26th May 2022 in full digital mode using NeVA.
- b) A resource team from Central Project Monitoring Unit, NeVA was deputed to visit Uttar Pradesh Assembly from 19th-27th May, 2022 to provide necessary support to Uttar Pradesh Assembly so as to enable them to run the budget session of Assembly using NeVA platform.
- c) The team also provided training to all the Members of UP Legislative assembly regarding use of NeVA eBook on Tablet Devices installed on their seats and business transaction inside the House using NeVA.

2. Training Workshop at Uttar Pradesh Legislative Council:

- a) A team comprising of the three officers from CPMU, NeVA was deputed to visit Uttar Pradesh Council for 3 days (from 09th to 11th May, 2022) to acquaint officers/officials of Legislature/NIC/Departments with various NeVA Modules. The workshop also included clarification of doubts of the officials of the council about the modules of NeVA.

3. Online training workshop through video conferencing:

- a) A 4 day (17th -20th May 2022) online training workshop through video conferencing was done by CPMU, NeVA for Sikkim Legislative Assembly. The workshop was organised to give an idea about NeVA software to various officials of Sikkim Assembly to enable them to use various modules of NeVA software. Clarification of their doubts was also done.
- b) Necessary support through telephonic/video conferencing mode was given by the technical team of CPMU, NeVA to help officials of various State Assemblies understand various modules of NeVA software and new features of NeVA application.

4. Signing of Memorandum of Understanding:

Jammu & Kashmir Legislative Assembly signed tripartite MoU with Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs on 25th May, 2022 becoming 21st House in the country to adopt NeVA for inside the house digitisation.
