- Implementation of Assurances in Parliament

From 1956 to February, 2022 a total of 97084 Assurances were culled out in Lok Sabha and 57133 Assurances were culled out in Rajya Sabha. Out of these 1090 Assurances of Lok Sabha and 617 Assurances of Rajya Sabha are pending.

During the month of March, 2022, 35 Assurances were culled out from Lok Sabha proceedings and 30 Assurances were culled out from Rajya Sabha proceedings.

- Functioning of Consultative Committees

Informal Consultative Committees were constituted for various Ministries/Departments of Government of India, first time in the year 1954 to provide opportunities to Members of Parliament to have some glimpse into the working of the Government. Nature of these Committees is advisory. At present 38 Consultative Committees are functioning for various Ministries.

a) The Assembly of Nagaland, a North-eastern State, has become the first Vidhan Sabhain the country to successfully install the necessary hardware in the Assembly for the implementation of National e-Vidhan Application (NeVA) in the State and also to conduct its proceedings using NeVA software in paperless mode.

b) Detailed Project Reports(DPR) of both Assembly and Council in Uttar Pradesh was approved by empowered committee headed by Secretary, MoPA and subsequently 1st instalment was released for implementation of NeVA. Uttar Pradesh Assembly, who submitted UC of 1st instalment, was also paid 2nd instalment for early roll out of the project.
